**4. Title:**    Juvenile justice; human trafficking screening.

**5. Summary:** Requires the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) to use trauma-informed screening measures to identify whether any child committed to DJJ has been a victim of human trafficking and determine the appropriate treatment and service options. The bill also requires that in cases in which a Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court or a Circuit Court orders a juvenile to be physically examined and treated by a physician or to be examined and treated at a local mental health center, that such examination also include trauma-informed screening measures to identify whether the juvenile has been a victim of human trafficking, and determine appropriated treatment and service options.
