4. Title: Virginia Motor Vehicle Warranty Enforcement Act.

5. Summary: This bill adds autocycles to the vehicles protected by the Virginia Motor Vehicle Warranty Enforcement Act (the Act), commonly known as the "lemon law." The bill applies the Act to vehicles purchased for business purposes by a business entity that owns or leases no more than five motor vehicles. The bill contains technical amendments.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Virginia Motor Vehicle Warranty Enforcement Act provides protections to purchasers of motor vehicles if the manufacturer, its agents or authorized dealers do not conform the motor vehicle to any applicable warranty by repairing or correcting any defect or condition, including those that do not affect the drivability of the vehicle, which significantly impairs the use, market value, or safety of the motor vehicle to the consumer after a reasonable number of attempts during the lemon law rights period.

This bill would amend current law to add autocycles to the type of motor vehicles that are protected under the Act and adding purchasers using motor vehicles for business purposes by a business entity that owns or leases no more than five vehicles to the types of purchasers protected under the Act.

No fiscal impact is anticipated as a result of this legislation.
