4. Title: Substance abuse services providers; assessment; tobacco use.

5. Summary: Requires every provider licensed by the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services who provides services to individuals with substance use disorder to assess each individual receiving services for use of all tobacco products at the time the provider begins providing services and provides that, in cases in which an individual receiving services is identified as having a tobacco use disorder, the provider shall (i) provide information to the individual about how continued use of tobacco products may affect the individual's long-term success in recovery from substance use disorder, (ii) recommend treatment for tobacco use disorder in the treatment plan, and (iii) offer either treatment for tobacco use disorder as part of the individual's treatment plan, if the provider is licensed to provide such treatment, or referral for treatment of tobacco use disorder.

8. Fiscal Implications: The legislation as drafted will not create a fiscal impact for the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services or state-operated DBHDS facilities. However, this legislation could create additional costs for substance use disorder providers. The possible impact to providers is indeterminate.
