**2. Patron:** Davis

**3. Committee:** Privileges and Elections

**4. Title:** Elections; political campaign advertisements, illegal ads, civil penalties.

**5. Summary:** Provides that sponsors violating political campaign advertisement disclosure laws with advertisements or campaign telephone calls that expressly advocate the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$25,000.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** See Item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** As stand-alone legislation, the Department of Elections considers implementation of this bill as “routine,” and does not require additional funding.

The bill provides for civil penalties not to exceed \$25,000 for disclosure violations that expressly advocate the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate, which shall be deposited in the general fund. Any potential revenue impact from the assessment of civil penalties is indeterminate.
