3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Sharing of forfeited assets; promoting law enforcement; community investment and revitalization.

5. Summary: Currently, forfeited property and proceeds, less 10 percent, is made available to federal, state and local agencies to promote law enforcement activities consistent with law and regulations adopted by the Criminal Justice Services Board to implement the asset-sharing program.

The proposed bill provides that proceeds may also be used to strengthen relationships between the community and law enforcement, encourage goodwill between the community and law enforcement, or promote cooperation with law enforcement. Additionally, all forfeited property, including its proceeds or cash equivalent, received by a participating state or local agency pursuant to this section must be used to promote law enforcement which may also include expenditures for community investment or revitalization that may strengthen relationships between the community and law enforcement, encourage goodwill between the community and law enforcement, or promote cooperation with law enforcement.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) does not anticipate any fiscal impact on agency operations as a result of the proposed legislation.
