3. Committee: Public Safety

4. Title: Correctional facilities; work release programs.

5. Summary: The engrossed version of the proposed legislation directs the Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security to convene a work group to study inmate work release programs. The bill provides that the work group shall report its findings and recommendations to the Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security and the Chairmen of the House Committee for Courts of Justice, House Committee on Public Safety, and Senate Committee on the Judiciary by December 1, 2022.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary (see Item 8 below).

8. Fiscal Implications: The Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security (Secretary) reports that any costs which result from the proposed legislation would be minimal and absorbable within existing resources. However, if multiple bills are passed during the 2022 General Assembly session which require the creation of workgroups, the Secretary reports that funding may be necessary to reimburse the travel costs of participating members.

Any costs which result from membership in the workgroup established by this bill are anticipated to be absorbable by the Office of the Executive Secretary, and the Department of Corrections.
