**3. Committee:** Courts of Justice

**4. Title:** Admission into evidence of certain forensic medical examination reports by sexual assault examiners.

**5. Summary:** The proposed legislation permits a sexual assault nurse examiner or sexual assault forensic examiner who performed a forensic medical examination to testify by two-way video conferencing if certain specified provisions are met. Additionally, the bill establishes that nothing in the section shall be construed as requiring a locality to purchase a two-way electronic video and audio communication system, and that any decision to purchase such a system is at the discretion of the locality.
