4. Title: Bail in subsequent proceeding arising out of initial arrest

5. Summary: The bill amends § 19.2-130 (Bail in subsequent proceeding arising out of initial arrest) to establish that any person who was previously admitted to bail by a judge or clerk of a district court or by a magistrate shall be granted bail and have the terms of bond or recognizance fixed in the amount or manner consistent with the prior admission to bail. But if the court having jurisdiction of the subsequent proceeding believes bail is inappropriate, or the amount of bond or security inadequate or excessive, it may deny bail, or change the amount of such bond or security, require new and additional sureties, or set other terms of bail as are appropriate to the case, including drug and alcohol monitoring.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Office of the Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court, the proposed bill is not expected to have a material fiscal impact on court system resources.

The Compensation Board does not have sufficient data about bond details for people released on bond to determine how the proposed bill could impact the pre-trial population. Therefore, the fiscal impact on jails cannot be determined at this time.
