4. Title: Health, Welfare, and Institutions

5. Summary: Reorganizes and clarifies provisions governing mandatory outpatient treatment. The bill also eliminates provisions allowing for a single order for a period of involuntary inpatient treatment followed by a period of mandatory outpatient treatment and instead requires entry of separate orders for involuntary inpatient and mandatory outpatient treatment in all cases.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: No fiscal impact on state agencies.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, the Department of Criminal Justice Services, and the State Compensation Board have all reported that this legislation will not have a material impact on their agency operations. It is possible that locally-operated Community Services Boards may have some additional administrative and training duties on the procedural change, however any possible cost is indeterminate.
