**4. Title:** Mandatory outpatient treatment.

**5. Summary:** Reorganizes and clarifies provisions governing mandatory outpatient treatment. The bill also eliminates provisions allowing for a single order for a period of involuntary inpatient treatment followed by a period of mandatory outpatient treatment and instead requires entry of separate orders for involuntary inpatient and mandatory outpatient treatment in all cases. The provisions of the bill shall become effective on October 1, 2022

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** No fiscal impact on state agencies.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, the Department of Criminal Justice Services, and the State Compensation Board have all reported that this legislation will not have a material impact on their agency operations. It is possible that locally operated Community Services Boards may have some additional administrative duties, however any possible cost is indeterminate.
