**3. Committee:** Health, Welfare, and Institutions

**4. Title:** Providers of treatment for opioid addiction; conditions for initial licensure; location.

**5. Summary:** Eliminates the requirement that a provider of treatment for persons with opiate addiction through the use of (i) methadone or (ii) opioid replacements other than opioid replacements approved for the treatment of opioid addiction by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration be located more than one-half mile from a public or private licensed day care center or a public or private K-12 school. The engrossed version of this bill delays the effective date of these changes to January 1, 2023.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** There is no fiscal impact resulting from the elimination of the distance requirement. The cost of building or moving facilities is borne by the providers.
