2. Patron: Robinson

3. Committee: Passed both Houses.

4. Title: Health care providers; health records of minors; available via secure website.

5. Summary: Provides that every hospital and health care provider that makes patients' health records available to such patients through a secure website shall make all health records of a patient who is a minor available to such patient's parent through such secure website unless the hospital or health care provider cannot make such health record available in a manner that prevents disclosure of information, the disclosure of which has been denied by a health care provider or for which required consent has not been provided.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Minimal, see item 8

8. Fiscal Implications: The provisions of this bill would not have a fiscal impact on the Department of Medical Assistance Services. Any fiscal impact for the Virginia Department of Health to amend regulations can be handled within existing resources.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: None.

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No.

11. Other Comments: VDH can absorb the cost to promulgate regulations for the provisions of a single bill with existing resources. However, if a large number of bills become law with a requirement that VDH promulgate or modify regulations, then VDH indicates it will need additional resources to handle the increase in workload.
