**4. Title:** Health insurance; coverage for prosthetic devices.

**5. Summary:** HB925 requires insurers, corporations, and health maintenance organizations proposing to issue group accident and sickness insurance policies to provide coverage for medically necessary prosthetic devices. The bill prohibits lifetime dollar maximums on prosthetics, unless applied to the aggregate of all items/services covered by a policy, and maintains the prohibition of coinsurance greater than 30% of the carrier's allowable charge for prosthetics. The provisions of the bill apply to any policy, contract, or plan delivered, issued, or renewed on and after January 1, 2023. These provisions do not apply to short-term travel, accident only, or disease-specific policies, Medicare contracts, Medicaid, policies issued in the individual market or small group markets, or short-term nonrenewable less than six months duration.
