4. Title: Unlawful hazing; penalty.

5. Summary: The bill substitute provides an affirmative defense for involuntary manslaughter or for hazing if a person in good faith seeks or obtains emergency medical attention for a person who has received a bodily injury by hazing or renders emergency care or assistance, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), to a person who has received a bodily injury by hazing while another person seeks or obtains emergency medical attention for such person.
