3. Committee: Judiciary

4. Title: Sealing of offenses resulting in a deferred and dismissed disposition or conviction by petition.

5. Summary: Provides that a defendant with a disorder or disability, defined in the bill as either autism spectrum disorder or an intellectual disability, as defined elsewhere in the Code, may file a petition that requests the sealing of the criminal history record information and court records of a Class 4 felony conviction or charge that has been deferred and dismissed. To be eligible, the court must have found by clear and convincing evidence that the criminal conduct was caused by or had a direct and substantial relationship to the disorder or disability.
