4. Title: Juvenile law-enforcement records; disclosures to school principals.

5. Summary: Provides that the chief of police or sheriff of a jurisdiction or his designee shall disclose to school principals that a juvenile has been charged, or may disclose when a juvenile is a suspect, in a violent juvenile felony, arson and related offenses, carrying a concealed weapon, or any of the various offenses listed under § 16.1-260(G). Under current law, a chief of police or sheriff may disclose information related to such charges, but is not required to do so.

8. Fiscal Implications: The proposed legislation is not expected to have a fiscal impact on the Department of State Police, the Department of Juvenile Justice, the Department of Education, or Direct Aid to Public Education, according to those agencies.
