**4. Title:** Foster care; barrier crimes.

**5. Summary:** Requires the Department of Social Services, together with relevant stakeholders, to develop recommendations regarding changes to provisions governing criminal history background checks and barrier crimes for applicants to serve as a foster or adoptive home. The Department of Social Services is required to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the Chairmen of the House Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions and the Senate Committee on Rehabilitation and Social Services by October 1, 2022.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The bill requires that the Department of Social Services and relevant stakeholders develop recommendations regarding changes to provisions governing criminal history background checks and barrier crimes for applicants to serve as a foster or adoptive home and report those findings by October 1, 2022.
