4. Title: Common interest communities; association complaint procedures.

5. Summary: Directs the Common Interest Community Board to review the feasibility of allowing audio and video recordings to be submitted with a notice of final adverse decision and report its findings to the Secretary of Labor, Chair of the House Committee on General Laws, and Chair of the Senate Committee on General Laws and Technology by November 1, 2022.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill increases the administrative responsibilities of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR) and Common Interest Community Board (Board) by requiring the Board to review the feasibility of allowing audio and video recordings to be submitted with a notice of final adverse decision as a record pertinent to the decision in accordance with § 54.1-2354.4, Code of Virginia. It is expected that at least three Board meetings will be needed to complete the review. The three additional board meeting costs are expected to total \$6,600. It is anticipated that the department can absorb these costs with existing appropriations.
