2. Patron: Marsden

3. Committee: Passed both houses.

4. Title: Improper parking.

5. Summary: Allows the governing body of any county, city or town in Planning District 8 to prohibit by ordinance the parking of a vehicle with its wheels partially or fully on the curb, or with its wheels straddling the curb. The bill provides that the ordinances may allow for fines or the towing of vehicles in violation under the direction of a law-enforcement officer or parking enforcement officer.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: Fines may be issued by counties, cities, or towns in Planning District 8 that develop relevant ordinances. The fiscal impacts are indeterminate, as it cannot be predicted how many people will be subject to these fines. Any revenues collected by localities would be retained by the localities.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Law enforcement agencies.

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No.

11. Other Comments: Localities in Planning District 8 that may develop ordinances include Loudoun, Prince William, Fairfax, and Arlington counties and the cities of Alexandria, Manassas, and Manassas Park.
