2. Patron: Vogel

3. Committee: Passed the Senate.

4. Title: Former law-enforcement officers; retention of identification and badge.

5. Summary: Provides that upon the request of a former law enforcement officer with at least 10 years or service who has been diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder, or who is disabled, the employing department or agency shall issue the individual a photo identification card indicating the individual is a former law enforcement officer who honorably served. The issuing agency or department must have it mounted in such a manner to make it impossible for anyone to carry it on his person. The department or agency must provide a written explanation to the requester of the grounds for any denial it makes. Additionally, any such former Department of State Police trooper shall be awarded his badge or other insignia of his office upon retirement, and such mounted badge or insignia shall include an indication that the individual served honorably.

8. Fiscal Implications: Any potential fiscal impact as a result of this bill on the Department of Conservation and Recreation can be absorbed within the agency's current budget. There is no anticipated fiscal impact as a result of the provisions of this bill on the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority, the Department of State Police, the Office of the State Inspector General, the Division of Capitol Police, or the Department of Juvenile Justice.
