2. Patron: Leftwich

3. Committee: Passed both houses.

4. Title: Sex offenders in emergency shelters; notification registration; penalty.

5. Summary: Provides that registered sex offenders who enter any emergency shelter operated in response to a state or local emergency shall, as soon as practicable, notify a member of the shelter's security staff of his status as a sex offender. The bill requires that no person shall be denied entry into an emergency shelter solely on the basis of his status as a registered sex offender unless such entry is otherwise prohibited by law. The bill also requires the Department of State Police to furnish a summary of these provisions to any person required to register as a sex offender.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Social Services (DSS) is responsible for operating state emergency shelters. DSS does not anticipate a fiscal impact as a result of this proposed bill.
