**4. Title:** Dissemination of consumer information about noxious weeds and invasive plants.

## 5. Summary:

This bill amends the Noxious Weeds Law (Va. Code § 3.2-800 et seq.) (Law) to direct the Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services to develop a model sign for retail establishments that sell plants that explains the benefits of native plants and the harm of noxious weeds and other invasive plants. The bill also directs the Commissioner to develop a model label that may be used for the wholesale and retail sale of plants that indicate the common and scientific name of the plant and whether the plant is native to the Commonwealth or invasive to eco-regions that include the Commonwealth.
