The \$1,000 impact stated represents a small cost of staff time for trai premiums. The Town carries property and liability insurance through services.				
It seems very unclear whether this bill actually expands employee protections beyond existing First Amendment case law, or simply codifies what is already heavily litigated and established as best-practice HR management. The bill does seem to reflect the Town's existing personnel policies. This may not be the case for all localities, and it seems likely to trigger litigation. If VRSA member localities face increased legal costs and settlements, premiums tend to rise for all member localities. That is the cause of the impact shown here.
