**4. Title:** Availability of complaint forms used by Judicial Inquiry and Review Commission

Summary:** The substitute bill adds subsection B. to § 17.1-917 (Assistance and information; complaint forms) to indicate that in all state courts within the Commonwealth a sign must be posted in a location accessible to the public that notes the availability of and provides instructions to obtain a downloadable electronic version of any standardized form developed and utilized by the Judicial Inquiry and Review Commission for the filing of a complaint from the official website of the judicial system of the Commonwealth.
